

## 79<sup>th</sup> Golden North Salmon Derby is Dedicated to Jerry and Barbara Burnett



Jerry and Barbara Burnett are no strangers to the Golden North Salmon Derby, nor to Territorial Sportsman, Inc. (TSI). Arriving in Juneau in 1981 from Ellensburg, Washington, the Burnett's plan was to spend one year in Alaska and then return to Washington. Barbara had a job as a school psychologist and Jerry tagged along for the experience. "Thing is," Barbara says, "we started going fishing after work and the fish were biting; they were still biting by the time the next school year started, and we forgot to leave!" And so, for the next four and a half decades the Burnetts have made Juneau their home, raising three children and getting involved in TSI, the Alaska Outdoor Council (AOC), the Golden North Salmon Derby, the Juneau Yacht Club, and more. They fished their first derby in 1983 and have only missed one or two since. Over the years the Burnetts have donated countless hours to TSI's derby, banquet, scholarships, and cabin building. Jerry credits Ron Somerville with pulling him and Barbara into TSI. Together with Ron, Mike Bethers, and others, Jerry participated in catching, tagging, and releasing dozens of salmon back in the years when tagged fish were a part of the derby protocol. In 2001 Jerry was elected to the TSI board of directors and served first as a member and later as president until 2019, when he stepped down to serve six years on the Governor-appointed Alaska Board of Game, the first three as a member and the last three as its chair. He also served on the AOC board of directors for several years, and in 2015 he and Barbara were named AOC members of the year for their impressive leadership with the TSI/AOC fundraising banquet.

Jerry has co-chaired the derby three times and he and Barbara have solicited prizes for both the derby and fundraising banquets for decades. When asked to recall especially memorable moments from their years of service, Jerry unabashedly relates the year he and co-chair, Doug Larsen, made the call to postpone the derby a week because of especially inclement weather. "It was a real inconvenient pain having to reschedule the derby, with all the many volunteers, participants, and scheduled events, but we simply couldn't in good conscience have people out risking their lives," Jerry recalls. "As inconvenient as it was, I still believe we made the right call."

Other highlights for Jerry include building and dedicating remote TSI cabins and serving on TSI's scholarship foundation where he awarded scholarships to deserving high school graduates. For Barbara, who has enlisted volunteers, coordinated, and led the derby's boat patrol since 2015, a highlight has been meeting new people, many of whom she and Jerry otherwise wouldn't have met. "It's fun meeting and working closely with generous volunteers on shared goals and commitments," Barbara says with reflective fondness. "And too," Barbara continues, "it was incredibly fun and rewarding to see the fundraising banquet grow from a few dozen participants to five hundred, with income for TSI's scholarships and other programs ballooning from a few thousand dollars to over one hundred thousand dollars." Much of the banquet's success can be deservedly attributed to Barbara's organization and leadership.

And then there was the derby of 1989! With excitement in his voice, Jerry shares the story. "It was early Sunday morning, the last day of the derby. Kevin Brooks and I were trolling in North Pass. It was the last derby in which downriggers were not allowed, so I had rigged a #5 Silver Bullet J-plug with a 16-ounce toothpick release weight. I was at about 95 feet, just above the bottom, when the fish hit. As it came to the surface I watched as the fish leapt into the air, recognizing immediately that it was a big one. After fighting the fish for several minutes, I eased it up near the side of the boat. The sun reflected off the water, making it difficult to see the fish as it came close. Kevin attempted to net it but ended up hitting the fish and pushing it away." With continued excitement Jerry went on. "I thought we were going to lose it, but thankfully Kevin managed to net it on his second attempt." As Kevin lifted the fish aboard, they gasped as they saw that one of the two hooks was gone and the other had been straightened out! "That 16-ounce weight nearly cost us that fish," Jerry observed.

With the fish aboard, they headed to Tee Harbor where the king's official weight was recorded as 39.8 pounds, the largest salmon entered in the derby in ten years. Feeling confident that their big king had won the derby, Jerry and Barbara headed to Fred Meyer to buy a celebratory bottle of champagne. It was there, after checking out at the counter, they received the news that Jay Ellis had turned in a 44-pound king only seconds before the derby ended! So near the end of the derby was Ellis' fish that he had tied a buoy to his anchor and left it at South Shelter as he raced to the Auke Bay weigh-in station. "

Yup," Jerry reflects, "in a heartbeat I went from first place with a \$15,000 prize to second place with a \$5,000 prize!" "Oh well," he continues with a chuckle, "I really can't complain; that prize has pretty much paid for all my derbies. I just didn't get the bragging rights!" Well Jerry and Barbara, you may not have gotten the bragging rights for catching the biggest fish in a derby, but you certainly get the bragging rights for being the honored recipients of the 79th annual Golden North Salmon Derby's dedication. Thank you both for your dedication, commitment, and service to TSI, our community, and our state! Keep fishin' ..... and for goodness' sake, keep those hooks tightly bent!



# Derby Rules

Please read these rules - Don't run the risk of being disqualified!

## **New 2025: No Validations Needed**

**Pink & chum salmon will not be accepted.** Derby participants are encouraged to return pink and chum salmon unharmed to the water unless they are retained for personal consumption.

**Derby entry fee and tickets.** Contestants 13 years and older must purchase a \$50 entry ticket. Veteran Tickets may be purchased for \$45. Contestants 6-12 years must purchase a \$10 entry ticket. These tickets are good for all days of the Derby. No refund of entry fees will be made.

**Derby officials.** Derby officials are at the boat docks, harbors, and the official fish packer in the Derby fishing grounds. The official fish packer will be clearly marked. Contestants must take their fish to these officials for checking and weighing to become eligible to enter the competition for one of the top prizes or other prizes.

**Eligibility.** Eligibility. Any person who has a Derby entry ticket is eligible to fish in the Derby. **You must be born before August 8, 2019 to participate in the derby (6 years of age).** Children ages 6-12 must be accompanied by an adult of at least 18 years of age. A person with a child ticket weighing a fish must be accompanied by an adult holding a derby ticket. Derby officials will check derby tickets of people accompanying a child weighing-in a fish. The person who weighs in the fish must be the person who caught the fish. In the case of a protest the anglers may be requested to pass a polygraph test.

**Entrants may not fish with non-entrants.** Non-entrants, regardless of age, may not fish in the same boat with entrants, but may go along for the enjoyment of the outing.

**Tackle.** Only lawful sport fishing tackle may be used.

**Boat fishing only.** Derby participation is restricted to fishing from vessels. Fish taken by dock fishing or shore fishing will not be accepted. All fish must be delivered in the round, uncleaned, to an official weigh-in station by vessel only.

**Weighing fish.** Only the following stations will have scales that must be used for official weighing of salmon:

Douglas Harbor:	7:30 am – 7 pm

Contestants may proceed directly to the fishing areas but may not have lines in the water before 7:30 am on Friday.

**Firearms.** Use of firearms from any boat will disqualify all contestants on that boat from the derby.

**Fish quality.** Salmon that show evidence of contamination, sun burn, bruising and/or flesh deterioration will not be accepted. Dark fish will not be accepted and the decision of a derby official is final. Help us maintain fish quality. Fish must be uncleaned in the round.

**Closing time.** A closing time of 6 p.m. announced by the officials at each dock on Sunday, by which time all boats wishing to enter fish at the weigh-in stations must be inside the finish line.

**Boats, speed and limits.** Every vessel propelled by machinery, regardless of horsepower, must have its name or number clearly displayed. Speed of all vessels during the derby, while within the reduced-speed areas (see map) is limited to five m.p.h. or less to avoid large wakes. Markers to indicate the reduced speed zones near the three shore-based weigh-in stations have been placed at reasonable distances from the station.

Any boat and all contestants thereon found in violation of speeding, boating outside the Derby area, or in any way posing a hazard to other contestants, shall be disqualified from the Derby.

**Prize policy & taxes.** The Territorial Sportsmen, Inc. is not responsible for any prizes donated by merchants who do not give as pledged. The values shown on the prize list are set by the donors. The Territorial Sportsmen, Inc. will not be responsible if any prizes prove to be less valuable than shown in the donor’s estimate. Taxes on all prizes are the responsibility of the individual winner. In accordance with IRS rules winners of prizes valued at \$600 or more must provide their taxpayer identification number at Award night. Failure to do so will result in withholding the prize.

# Rules Continued...

**Derby area limits.** Waters open to derby participants are described as follows:

*North boundary lines* — those waters South of a line from Point Bridget (58.40.699N, 134.59.25W) on the mainland to Point Whidbey (58.34.708N, 135.8.261W) on the Chilkat Peninsula; and, those waters south of a line extending from Cooper Point (58.14.215N, 134.6.371W) to the north shore of Greely Point (58.12.864N, 134.5.188W) in Taku Inlet.

*South boundary lines* — those waters north of a line extending from Point Lizard Head (58.10.9N, 134.52.7W) to the south shore of Rocky Island (58.10.6N, 135.03.15W) and then to the south end of Entrance Island (58.11.7N, 135.05.08W), and, those waters North of a line extending from Twin Point (57.54.642N, 133.59.644W) on the Glass Peninsula, to Point Styleman (57.58.455N, 133.53.958W) on the mainland.

**Swanson Harbor and Port Snettisham are open for overnight anchorage, but are outside of the Derby Grounds.**

All other waters are closed to Derby fishing.

**A contestant** may not take a boat out of the Derby area limits. The contestant may return the boat to the harbor or take a boat from the water to trailer home. The contestant may return a boat to a harbor even if the contestant has a weigh-in fish but does not return to the harbor during official weigh-in hours.

**Protests.** Protests of any nature must be made in person at the Officials' stations. Then the contestant must present his or her case personally to the Board of the Territorial Sportsmen, Inc. at their derby certification meeting at noon on the Tuesday following the Derby.

**Certification.** The certification meeting will be at Elgee Rehfeld, LLC at noon on the Tuesday following the Derby. Decisions of the Board are final.

**Special note.** Derby participants must comply with the Alaska Dept. of Fish & Game sports fishing regulations. Contestants cited for violating these regulations while in the Derby will be disqualified.

**Special note.** For special prizes and scholarship prizes involving age, gender, or veteran status: the contestant must request that the dock worker note the angler's age, gender, or status as a veteran on the weigh-in slip.


## Handle Your Fish With Care

Please help provide more money for scholarships by taking care of your fish! The following guidelines have been provided by the Alaska Department of Fish & Game for keeping your fish in the best possible condition so the maximum value is retained.

Do everything possible to preserve the quality of your fish:

- Do not clean your fish!! **Turn in your fish in the round**
- **Ice** fish in a slush mixture of 1/3 ice to 2/3 sea water (ice is available at all weigh in stations)
- Keep fish moist and cool
- Turn in fish as soon as possible

*\*State of Alaska Dept. of Environmental Conservation regulations do not allow cleaned fish to be accepted by the Derby.*



# HOW TO IDENTIFY PACIFIC SALMON SPECIES

## KING (CHINOOK) SALMON:

Blue-gray with silvery sides. Small, irregular-shaped black spots on back, dorsal fin, and usually on both lobes of the tail.



Black mouth with **black** gums at base of teeth on lower jaw. →



Spawning king salmon adults lose their silvery bright color and take on a maroon to olive brown color.

## COHO SALMON:

Greenish-blue back with silvery sides. Small black spots on the back, dorsal fin, and usually on upper lobe of the tail only.



Black mouth with **white** gums at base of teeth on lower jaw. ↓



Spawning coho salmon adults develop greenish-black heads and dark brown to maroon bodies.

## SOCKEYE (RED) SALMON:

Dark blue-black back with silvery sides. No distinct spots on back, dorsal fin, or tail.



Spawning sockeye salmon adults develop dull green colored heads and brick-red to scarlet bodies.

## CHUM (DOG) SALMON:

Dull gray back with yellowish-silver sides.

No distinct spots on back or tail. Large eye pupil - covers nearly the entire eye.



Spawning adults develop olive green coloration on the back with maroon sides with irregular dull red bars. Males exhibit many large canine-like teeth.

## PINK (HUMPIES) SALMON:

Very large spots on the back and large black oval blotches on both tail lobes. Very small scales.



Spawning adults take on a dull gray coloration on the back and upper sides with a creamy white color below. Males develop a pronounced hump.




## Derby Fishing Area
